CRITERIUM SERIES OPENS UP TO WOMEN AND VETERANS

The 2015 Fulton Hogan Criterium Cup at the Tasmanian Christmas Sports Carnivals will expand to include closed-circuit street races for female riders and veterans at Westbury on Monday, December 28.

It is a major initiative for the Sports Carnivals' Association of Tasmania which introduced criteriums into the time-honoured traditional format three years ago in an endeavour to bolster the interstate and international status of the carnivals and provide a greater variety of racing for cyclists.

Large squads of riders from Japan, New Zealand and the Australian mainland will contest the 2015 criteriums, which will also showcase elite men's races at Westbury, at Sheffield on Tuesday, December 29, and Burnie on New Year's Eve.

The champion Japanese rider Eiya Hashimoto (pictured), who amazingly finished runner-up in the Latrobe, Launceston, Devonport and Burnie Wheelraces at last year's carnival series, is contesting the criteriums. So are 13 of his compatriots, including seven women, and 10 New Zealanders.

SCAT president Mike Gunson thanked the Meander Valley, Kentish and Burnie City Councils for hosting the criteriums: "These municipalities have made a great contribution to the long-term viability of the carnivals," he said.
